Camp Isaiah is a phenomenal experience. Those that have attended over the years have gone away feeling like they experienced something very special for that week of their life. At camp we seek to integrate the spiritual and athletic lives of youth.

- Campers stay in a gender separated dorm at 9,000 feet at Pingree Park, the Colorado State University mountain campus. Camper to leader ratio is usually 5 to 1 or better. The food is fantastic.
- We have daily devotionals and small group sessions that seek to teach kids the basics of Christian spirituality. (Camp Isaiah is non-denominational...see website for statement of faith)
- We run epic, amazing, gorgeous, trails in the mountains of Colorado near Rocky Mountain National Park.
- We have clinics that teach kids the fundamentals of distance running. Elite distance runners and coaches occasionally show up to speak.
- We have a week long smorgasbord of games, fun and fellowship during the famous "Camp Isaiah Tournament of Champions"... where YES everyone is a winner as the prize pool is usually loaded with great prizes.
- We also have various entertainment provided by musical guests and dance groups.
- Each participant receives a goodie bag full of various items, most notably a camp logo hooded sweatshirt.



Location and Directions

Camp Isaiah is held at Pingree Park, which is the Colorado State University Mountain Campus located west of Fort Collins.

To reach Ft. Collins from Denver: Traveling north from Denver International Airport (DIA), take I-25 North to Fort Collins and Exit 269 going west (Mulberry Street/Hwy. 14) to North College Avenue (Hwy. 287). Traveling south from Wyoming, take I-25 South to Exit 269, going west to North College Avenue (Hwy 287).

To reach the Pingree Park Campus from Ft. Collins, go north on U.S. 287 to mile marker 22. Turn west on Hwy. 14 going up Poudre Canyon. Stay on Hwy. 14 to mile marker 96 which is the turnoff for Pingree Park (County Rd. 63E). Turn south across the bridge and drive on a gravel road for 16 miles to reach Pingree Park.

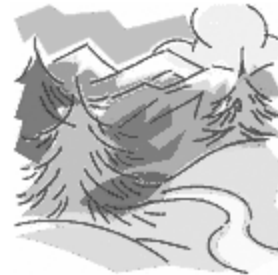
